• THE FIGHT AGAINST CLIMATE

• RURAL ISSUES (JOURNALISM AND

HOUSING): As the Chair of the Rural Caucus, I have advanced essential matters such as funding for municipal infrastructure and support for our local media, areas that are continually evolving.

• SUPPORT TO SMEs:

I am committed to supporting your innovative projects requiring coordination between different levels of government. We have funded over 100 of your projects this year.

• **EVENTS**: Being close to you across our vast territory, I value our exchanges during your wonderful and various events. This year, I took part in over 160 of your wonderful activities in the riding.

• THE MOST VULNERABLE:

I also strive to assist those in vulnerable situations to ensure their access to necessary aid. We worked on over 500 citizen files.








GATINEAU PARK

Since my election as Member of Parliament for Pontiac, I have worked tirelessly to strengthen the protection of Gatineau Park. With the support and collaboration of my colleagues in Parliament, as well as local organizations such as Canadian Parks and Wilderness Society – Ottawa Valley Chapter (CPAWS-OV), we are unanimous: quality protection of our green spaces, wetlands, and areas of high biodiversity value in the region is essential if we are to achieve our goal of protecting 30% of our territory by 2030. Now, more than ever, is the time to act to protect Gatineau Park in perpetuity within a legislative framework. Let's make Gatineau Park a real Park!

PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS

I am happy to be your voice on Parliament Hill. As a member of the Finance Committee, I contributed to the study of pre-budget consultations and the 2023 budget. I also initiated a motion to study green finance. Currently, on the Foreign Affairs and International Development Committee, we are analyzing the Russia-Ukraine border and Canadian diplomacy, while on the Environment Committee, we are studying the issue of fresh water. Meanwhile, as Chair of the Rural Caucus, I advocate for the needs of rural communities, defending health care, community radio and local newspapers, as well as rural housing needs. As Chair of the Outaouais Caucus and Co-Chair of the National Capital Region (NCR) Caucus, I work with my colleagues to protect Gatineau Park and interprovincial transportation in the National Capital Region.





COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT AND CITIZEN SERVICES

When I am not in Parliament, I take the opportunity to spend time with you, in our beautiful riding. Taking the time to listen and discuss with you is very important to me. These meetings enable me to serve you better every day and support you in your projects.

Here are a few highlights by the numbers:

- In addition to my work in Parliament, I have participated in. a little over 160 events and activities in the riding.
- I sent out 6 program bulletins to ensure community leaders are aware of new programs and completed around 50 program research requests for various initiatives and amazing projects in the riding.
- I responded personally and substantially to over 400 of your correspondences.
- My team and I have worked on over 500 citizen files: Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada; Canada Revenue Agency; Service Canada, Phoenix, and others.
- Our government has funded more than 100 amazing projects (not counting Canada Summer Jobs program), supporting innovation and economic growth in our riding.

I always enjoy starting the new year by meeting with elected municipal officials to understand their priorities, so that we can align on common goals. I'm proud to be surrounded by dedicated elected officials who, like me, have the well-being of each and every one of you at heart. On December 11, along with the Honourable Pablo Rodriguez, I took part in the announcement of funding for the widening of Pink Road and La Vérendrye Boulevard West. This joint federal-provincial investment of \$70.4 million over 5 years will enable Gatineau to make crucial improvements to our road network.
